RE: INFORMATION FOR THE 2024 GIRLS VOLLEYBALL SEASON

Welcome to another volleyball season! We are thrilled to be entering another amazing season! Please pay particular attention to the calendar dates in this document. This handbook will serve as a guide to assist you with your planning and it should be used as a source for quick reference to questions regarding dates, committee personnel, administrative duties, and day-to-day organization of matches and tournaments, as well as regional and state information.

A few important **CHSAA bylaws** that I want to highlight:

1. **2310.5 SUNDAY CONTACT** — No high school interscholastic contests, practices for interscholastic contests, camps, nor association between participants and coaches/directors of any CHSAA sanctioned sport from the student's school shall take place on Sundays **during the competitive high school season (start of official practice through the state tournament)**. The Commissioner may, when deemed advisable, allow postponed state-level events to be played on Sunday. Teams playing on Monday in district, regional or in a state-culminating event will be exempt from this rule.
 - a. **EXCEPTION 1** – During the formal sports season a coach may have contact with his or her team on Sunday for a social, academic or service related activity that is strictly voluntary. The contact must be a voluntary, non-competitive/non-participatory activity.
 - b. **EXCEPTION 2** – During the school year, schools may petition the Commissioner for a waiver of the Sunday Contact Rule based upon religious, cultural, or educationally based events (non-athletic).

If questions arise and interpretations are needed, please do not hesitate to call the CHSAA office after contacting your athletic director. Please keep in mind that you are our best public relations director. Not only have your peers respected your role as a coach and leader, but also by your students and community members as well.

Before the competitive interscholastic season begins, check to make sure you have not scheduled contests in excess of the game/contest limit for your sport - 19 for lower levels and 23 for varsity (see [CHSAA Sport Bylaws](#)).

Good luck! Your upcoming season will pass quickly and your efforts and accomplishments will be memorable to those involved in your tennis program.

SPORT SPECIFIC CHANGES

MAJOR CHANGE FROM PAST 2 YEAR'S REPORT:

- A. Eliminated geography in the regional seeding criteria as a consideration for alignment.
- B. Created a "default" date and time for regionals if a date and time cannot be mutually agreed upon - Saturday at 10 am.

RATIONALE FOR MAJOR CHANGE:

- A. A survey sent to the membership shows data supporting the elimination of removing geography as a seeding criteria. The majority of the membership is in support of keeping the "seeds" true to the CHSAA Index as much as possible
- B. In the situation where the schools do not mutually agree on a date or time, Saturday at 10 am must be used.

2024-2025 NFHS VOLLEYBALL RULE CHANGES

4-2-3a, 7-1-1 NOTE: Allows a player to change uniform numbers without penalty when a uniform is damaged in addition to when a uniform has blood on it.

Rationale: Adds language to Rule 4: Uniforms regarding the proper procedure for a legal uniform number change and expands to include a damaged uniform as a legal reason for changing a uniform number. Aligns language in Rules 4 & 7.

5-4-3c(1): Allows all players on the roster, not just starting players, to stand on their respective end lines prior to the first set.

Rationale: Encourage the inclusion of all players in the prematch announcements.

5-9-2b NOTE (NEW), State Association Adoption Chart: Requires line judges to switch sides of the court between sets when, by state association adoption, teams remain on the same benches throughout the match

Rationale: Aligns with the original intent of the rule allowing line judges to alternate between each set to promote fair officiating.

11-4-1b: Allows teams to substitute during any injury time-out for the libero replacement if the libero is injured or ill.

Rationale: Allows for the immediate substitution of the libero replacement who may be playing out of position due to the injury to the libero.

NFHS Volleyball Press Release - Line Judge Procedure Modified

Uniform Rule modification 2024-25: Undershirts & Undershorts/tights

Reference Rule 4-1 Note 2: Each state association may, in keeping with applicable laws, authorize exceptions to NFHS playing rules to provide reasonable accommodations to individual participants with disabilities and/or special needs, as well as those individuals with unique and **extenuating circumstances**. The accommodations should not fundamentally alter the sport, heighten risk to the athlete/others or place opponents at a disadvantage.

Modification 1: Visible undershirts worn under the uniform top must conform to one of three color options.

- 1.) Be one color that is similar to the dominant color of the uniform top.
- 2.) Black for dark colored uniform tops
- 3) White for light colored uniform tops

NOTE: All players with the exception of the libero that have visible undershirts must wear the same similar color. They may not have one player in a black undershirt and another player wearing a red undershirt. The team must decide on one color undershirt. The libero will match their dominate color uniform top or black for dark uniform top or white for a light uniform top.

Modification 2: Visible undershorts/tights that extend below the uniform bottom must conform to one of three color options.

- 1.) Be one color that is similar to the dominant color of the uniform bottom.
- 2.) Black for dark colored uniform tops
- 3) White for light colored uniform tops

NOTE: All players including the libero that have visible undershorts/tights must wear the same similar color. They may not have one player wearing black tights and another one wearing white tights. The team must decide on one color.

Situation 1: Player A in a red uniform top is wearing a white undershirt, and wearing black shorts with black tights extending below. **Ruling:** This is legal based on our adopted uniform modification. The undershirt's color does not need to match the undershort's color.

Situation2: Team A teammates are wearing black shorts and Team A libero is wearing red shorts. **Ruling:** The libero will **NOT** enter the game until they wear a short that is like-colored to players on the court.

Situation 3: Players are wearing black undershirts and a bench teammate is wearing a white undershirt. **Ruling:** The bench teammate and potential substitution with the white undershirt will not enter the game until they remove the white undershirt or match the players on the court with a like-color undershirt.

Situation 4: Player A is wearing a black arm sleeve and a white leg sleeve. **Ruling:** There is no current wording in the rule code to address colors for sleeves. Sleeves are not considered an undergarment and do not need to be ruled upon for color legality. **NOTE:** A single visible manufacturer's logo and/or single school name or insignia no more than 2 ¼ inches are permitted on each visible garment is the only rule that applies to sleeves.

The schools have been sent the same message.

COLORADO COACHES

CODE OF ETHICS



- **PROFESSIONALISM A COACH will** uphold the honor and dignity of the profession. In all personal contact with students, officials, athletic directors, school administrators, the state high school athletic association, the media, parents, and the public, the coach will strive to set an example of the highest ethical and moral conduct.
- **INFLUENCE A COACH will** be aware that he or she has a tremendous influence on the education of the student and, thus, shall place the highest value on instilling the ideals of character. The coach will realize that he or she is a role model, both in the school, the community and on social media accounts, and his or her actions must live up to their words.
- **LIFE LESSONS A COACH will** know that the lessons of the game are more important than the outcome of the game, and the coach will demonstrate an understanding of the athletes' growth and development in life beyond the game.
- **PRIORITIES A COACH will** remember that the game is for the young people, and will place the athletes' needs and interests before his or her own.
- **SPORTSMANSHIP A COACH will** personally demonstrate sportsmanship, and exert his or her influence to enhance sportsmanship by all team members and spectators.
- **RULES A COACH will** master the contest rules and shall teach them to his or her team members. The coach shall honor both the spirit and letter of the rules.
- **SAFETY A COACH will** ensure a safe environment and safe equipment, and practice safe training techniques based on current practices.
- **OFFICIALS A COACH will** respect and work with officials, understanding their importance and the role that they play in the event.
- **TRAINING RULES A COACH will** take an active role in promoting a positive lifestyle and in the prevention of alcohol, tobacco and drug usage by team members.
- **SOCIAL MEDIA A COACH will** use team social media for only positive communication, team promotion, and team building, and encourage team members to use social media responsibly.
- **PARTNERS A COACH will** work with the athletic director to be knowledgeable about and follow school district policies and procedures, and CHSAA rules and bylaws.
- **CONTINUED DEVELOPMENT A COACH will** continue his or her own professional development through coaching clinics, and other learning tools. The coach will continually seek a mastery of coaching principles and techniques and show interest in continual growth.

Welcome Volleyball Coaches,

The 2024-25 season is fast approaching. As officials we have started our training **programs in preparation** to do our best for you on the court.

NFHS Volleyball New Rules & POE (highlights):

4-2: Legal uniforms, officials have been directed to enforce uniform compliance at the varsity level from day one. Schools should contact the CHSAA if they have any questions or concerns on the legality of their uniform combinations.

4-2-1h(3) & 4-2-1i(2): The CHSAA undergarment modification allow teams to use black undergarments (for dark colored uniforms), white undergarments (for light colored uniforms) or dominate color of the uniform.

4-2-3: Allows a player to change uniforms and correct the roster and line-up without a penalty due to blood or damage

5-4-3c(1): Allows all team members to be on the endline for pre-match announcements.

5-9-2b: When teams by state adoption do not switch sides of the court, the line judges will then switch sides of the court per set to promote fair officiating

11-4-1b: Allows teams to substitute for a replacement player during a referee's time-out when the libero is injured or ill

12: Sporting conduct is still a main concern each year. Interscholastic sports are an extension of the classroom. As such we should not allow behavior on the court or benches that would not be allowed in the classroom. All parties should be respectful to one another at all times. Officials and coaches have the greatest influence during a match to promote sporting behavior. It is a collaborative effort between officials and coaches to lead by example exhibiting the highest level of respect and sporting behavior towards one another.

All CVOA officials are required to attend study sessions, a regional clinic, and pass the NFHS volleyball test, **as well as** a complete review and application of all rules and points of emphasis from NFHS.

I look forward to seeing many of you on the court this year.

CHSAA GENERAL GUIDELINES

PLAYER BENCH OCCUPANTS

Teams will always be seated on the same side of the net as they play (NFHS 9-1-2, 9-2-2), unless approval has been granted from the CHSAA office after proving that a competitive advantage occurs by not switching sides. **At state, the higher seeded team will choose which side they will be on.*

During the contests, the player bench may be occupied only by the following: eligible substitutes, coach, assistant coaches, faculty representatives, team managers, team statisticians and scorekeeper, team trainer or doctor, and disqualified players, unless they have been instructed to remove themselves from the player bench.

WARM-UP

There will be a maximum 15 minute warm-up period between matches unless the scheduled start time dictates otherwise. The 15 minutes will begin as soon as the court is cleared from the preceding match. It is the responsibility of the home site's administrator to oversee warm-up time.

The following format is **highly recommended**:

- 5 minutes – Both teams on their side of the court.
- 5 minutes – Visiting team both sides of the court (including serving).
- 5 minutes – Home team both sides of the court.

PENALTY FOR LEAVING THE PLAYING FLOOR BEFORE MATCH IS COMPLETED

Withdrawing a team from the playing floor before the completion of a contest can have great consequences. The CHSAA Constitution and Bylaws state: "No member school may withdraw its team from an athletic contest prior to the termination of the contest, except by mutual consent of the responsible faculty representatives from the participating schools."

DISQUALIFICATION FOR UNSPORTSMANLIKE CONDUCT

Any player who has been ejected from a match or tournament for committing any unsportsmanlike act shall be disqualified for the remainder of that match or contest. In addition, the player shall be ineligible for the next regularly scheduled match or contest of the same level (sophomore, junior varsity, or varsity). She may not take part in any other sets or contests at any level during this time. The number of matches, meets or contests for which the participant has been declared ineligible will decrease the stated maximum allowable matches, meets or contests in each sport for the disqualified participant. A school may not schedule a contest after an ejection in order to circumvent the penalty.

If such ejection occurs in the final match or contest of the season, then that player shall be ineligible for the first match or contest of the next season of sport that player elects to play. In satisfying the penalty, the player must sit out a set in a sport in which she completes the season. Any player ejected from a second match or contest during the same season shall be ineligible for the next two matches or contests of the same level. Any player ejected from a third match or contest during the same season shall be subject to a penalty to be determined by the Commissioner.

PROTOCOL FOR DISQUALIFICATION/EJECTION OF A PLAYER OR COACH

For all sports, a player ejected from a contest must be escorted to the bench by a game official and remains there supervised by a bench coach.

A coach ejected or disqualified (some NFHS rules books use the word disqualification in lieu of ejection) from a contest must be removed from the playing facility or confines and be prohibited from any further contact, with the team, direct or indirect, during the remainder of the game. For failure of the coach to comply, the game official may forfeit the contest.

VOLLEYBALL UNIFORMS

Please be sure to check the uniform regulations found in the NFHS Volleyball Rules Book. It is highly recommended that you give the manufacturer a copy of the rules book when you order new uniforms. **DO NOT HAVE YOUR UNIFORM MANUFACTURER CALL THE CHSAA OFFICE WITH QUESTIONS. WE WILL NOT BE LIABLE FOR ILLEGAL UNIFORMS.**

****SCHOOLS SHOULD CONTACT THE CHSAA OFFICE DIRECTLY TO ENSURE COMPLIANCE. **** Although like uniforms are preferred at all levels, varsity is the only level that will be penalized for uniform violations.

SCORING FOR SUB-VARSITY MATCHES

It is strongly recommended that 2 out of 3 sets be played at all sub-varsity levels to enhance time management constraints. Further recommendations to shorten nights include:

1. Go to fewer points such as 15 or 21 (can have a cap such as 15 points or 21) Therefore, teams could win 15-14 or 21-20; you don't have to win by 2 points if there is a cap.
2. Monitor warm-up time between matches.
3. Flip coins before the first sub-varsity match for all matches that will be played that evening/day.
4. Use of multiple nets and/or gymnasiums where available.

* Play is recommended for Saturdays to decrease the amount of school missed and alleviate travel time.

* *If a team from a league that has adopted a certain format plays a team from a league that has adopted a different format the two coaches must agree before the match begins. Otherwise it will be 3 out of 5 sets to 25 points (no cap) with the deciding set to 15 points (no cap).*

COACHES PLEASE NOTE:

- ❑ **Ball to be used at the State Tournament: Wilson K1 Gold – H1895A. Color: RED/WHITE/BLUE**
- ❑ **It is the coaches' responsibility to update season and playoff stats and records through MaxPreps (www.maxpreps.com). No hard copies of season results should be submitted to the CHSAA.**
- ❑ **Schools that are not member schools of state associations affiliated with the NFHS shall not be counted towards the RPI calculation. They shall be treated as no contest.**
- ❑ Have your principal contact the CHSAA office if you are involved in the state championship and you have an athlete whose parents are not financially able to attend the event.
- ❑ Head coach attendance at a rules meeting is **mandatory**; this is a CHSAA Bylaw requirement. You can satisfy this requirement only by watching the Rules Meeting online through the rSchool coaching platform.

EVALUATE GAME OFFICIALS/ARBITER:

***Note: Athletic Directors and Coaches can evaluate game officials in Arbiter Sports after the game has finished. To do this, go to www.arbitersports.com, then click on the Evaluations Tab and you will see the games that are ready to be evaluated. If you or your coach needs to be added to arbiter to evaluate, please email Monica Tillman at mtillman@chsaa.org. Please provide full name, school and current email address.

CHECK YOUR SCHEDULES:

- Before the competitive interscholastic season begins, check to make sure you have not scheduled contests in excess of the set/contest limit for your sport (see CHSAA Sport Bylaws). *If you have to break a contract, your school will be responsible for a “reimbursement fee” to the offended school (\$500-\$1,000), and will be placed on probation or restriction.*
- It is strongly recommended that coaches be clear on the number of matches their team will play in a given tournament. This information must be included in the tournament contract.
- Member schools shall not participate in more than 23 matches, exclusive of regional and state contests during a season.
- In order to qualify for the playoffs, a team must compete in a minimum of 18 matches against member schools.
- All JV level teams or below are only allowed a maximum of 19 matches.
- A student may not participate in more than 115 sets exclusive of regional and state tournament matches.

1. Select “Coach Login” on the top right-hand side of the webpage.
2. Enter your e-mail address –This will be the e-mail address used to access your team.
3. Next, if you are a **Returning Users** enter your password. (**New Users – See steps 7 through 9**).
4. After entering your password, the website will notify you that your accounts have been linked. The next time you visit the site, simply click on “Sign In” to access your team.
5. Once the login process is completed, use the top toolbar to add in or upload your roster, schedule a game, and enter/edit stats.
6. If you are a **New User** you must register your e-mail address and create a password. The system will prompt you of these steps.
7. Next, as a **New User** you will be prompted to enter your Access Code. Please contact your AD for this information. Once your access code is entered you will be taken to your Team Page.
8. Once the login process is completed, use the top toolbar to add in or upload your roster, schedule a game, and enter/edit stats.

REGIONAL VOLLEYBALL INFORMATION

1. Regional sites and officials will be selected by appointed school administrators. Regional sites are determined by the CHSAA Volleyball Seeding Committee.
2. **QUALIFIERS:** All Regionals (2A-5A) will have three teams – a total of three matches will be played. 1A will have 2 teams so only 1 match is needed. All Regional Winners will automatically earn a berth to the State Championships.
3. **OFFICIALS:** Officials will be selected by the regional directors or assignor. Line judges must be adults. If available, registered officials shall be used. Line judge fees would be part of the host school expenses. Line judges will use flags at the State Tournament. Regional Site Directors must use flags.
4. **TIE BREAKING PROCEDURE** must be utilized (see Tie Breaking method in this bulletin). The hot line number (720-581-8102) must be used whenever there is a tie to verify tie-breaker accuracy for final standings.
5. **It is recommended that all Regionals be played on Saturday (whenever possible).* Match times are approximate; pool play 3 out of 5 sets to 25 points with deciding set to 15 points using rally scoring (no cap) will be used for regional play. **When mutual agreement cannot be reached for the Regional Volleyball tournament, and travel distance for any team is 150 miles or greater, then the Regional tournament will be played on Saturday. A Friday Regional tournament will be considered a reasonable option if travel distance is under 150 miles for all teams involved. **NEW: If mutual agreement cannot be found between teams who are NOT traveling more than 150 miles, the default time for regionals is Saturday at 10 am.**
6. **REGIONAL GATELISTS:** Must be given to the **Regional tournament director** prior to play begins https://chsaanow.com/documents/2021/9/29//Volleyball_Regional_Gatelist.pdf?id=684
DO NOT SUBMIT THE REGIONAL GATELIST TO THE CHSAA OFFICE.
14 players maximum + 6 coaches/managers may be listed for a total of 20.
7. **RESULTS IN MAXPREPS** – It is the responsibility of each school advancing to the State Tournament to make sure their entire record and results are entered into MaxPreps.

REGIONAL GUIDELINES (ALL CLASSES):

REGIONAL TOURNAMENT DIRECTORS

- Regional Directors must communicate to participating schools; all schools in your regional should know specifics about your facilities, starting time, pairings, exact locations of all sites, etc.
- Regional Directors must text CHSAA staff the results of your regional tournament in order to have results live and correct on our website.

WARM-UP

There will be a maximum 15 minute warm-up period between matches unless the scheduled start time dictates otherwise. The 15 minute warm-up will begin as soon as the 15-minute rest period occurs after the previous match. It is the responsibility of the home site's management to oversee warm-up time. The following format is **highly recommended**:

- 5 minutes – Both teams on their side of the court.
- 5 minutes – Visiting team both sides of the court (including serving).
- 5 minutes – Home team both sides of the court.

TEAM PRACTICE

Schools are not permitted to practice at their regional site the week of the tournaments. Teams that normally practice and/or play at these sites are exempt from this policy.

ROSTERS

Each school may suit up 14 players for the tournament. Once the 14 players' names are placed in the score book/gatelist for the first match at the Regional Volleyball Tournament, no other names may be entered the remainder of the tournament. Names on a team may change between district, regional, and state.

OFFICIAL BALL

Wilson Sporting Goods, through the CHSAA, will provide the Wilson K1 Gold – H1895A tournament balls for the regional tournament. **Balls will be shipped to host sites the Monday before the tournament begins.** Substitute balls may not be used.

SCHEDULE

- *It is recommended that all regionals be played on Saturday (whenever possible).* Match times are approximate. National Federation rules dictate 3 out of 5 sets to 25 points (no cap) with the deciding set to 15 points (no cap).
- Site Directors should allow for 15-minute rest period for teams having played back-to-back matches prior to a subsequent warm-up and match.
- **NOTE: Tournament Directors must play all matches in the regional tournament. If the last match is "meaningless," it will be the best 2/3 sets.**

REGIONAL SEEDING/PAIRING AND SITES

With two/three teams in each regional, only one court is necessary. Those schools hosting regionals should have adequate seating capacity. Standards without cables attached to the floor should be used for safety reasons.

1. All league champions (as long as there is a minimum of 5 teams in the league) will automatically earn a berth to regionals.
2. The remaining teams (up to 24: 1A and up to 36: 2A-5A) will be selected straight off of the *CHSAA Selection & Seeding Index (50% CHSAA RPI & 50% MaxPreps Rankings)* published at the end of the regular season.
3. Teams will then be seeded based on the *CHSAA Selection & Seeding Index*
 - a. Once on the bracket, teams can be moved one spot at a maximum based upon trying to alleviate league opponent matchups between the top 2 seeds in the region. Host teams will not be moved.
4. Teams seeded No. 1 through 12 will host regionals.
5. All regional winners will automatically advance to the state championships.

STATE INFORMATION

1. **1A-5A Classifications:** Twelve (12) regional winners will advance to state.
2. The CHSAA Selection & Seeding Index published the Monday prior to Regionals will be the only seeding consideration for State.
3. Based on the state seeding criteria, 12 teams will be seeded onto a bracket. The top 4 teams will have a first round BYE. Competition will begin on Thursday at 8 a.m.
4. Double elimination bracket until the semifinals. Single elimination through the semifinals and finals.
5. All matches at the state tournament will be three out of five sets.
6. **OFFICIALS:** Officials are assigned using input from schools and CVOA. They have been carefully selected from all available officials registered with CHSAA. Daily match assignments are made by CHSAA staff members without consultation with school officials.
7. **OFFICIAL BALL:** Wilson Sporting Goods, through the CHSAA, will provide the Wilson K1 Gold –(RED/WHITE/BLUE) tournament balls for the state tournament.
8. **GATELIST:** Each school may suit up 14 players for the tournament. Once the 14 players' names are placed on the gatelist and in the scorebook for the first match at the State Volleyball Tournament, no other names may be entered for the remainder of the tournament. Names on a team *may* change between regionals & state. Each coach **must submit a gate list online** and each player will be checked by name upon entry. The state gate list is due to the CHSAA office by **Tuesday, November 7th**.

AWARDS PRESENTATION

Please ask your fans to remain off the court; there will be a formal presentation. The awards will be brought to mid-court and presented following each championship set.

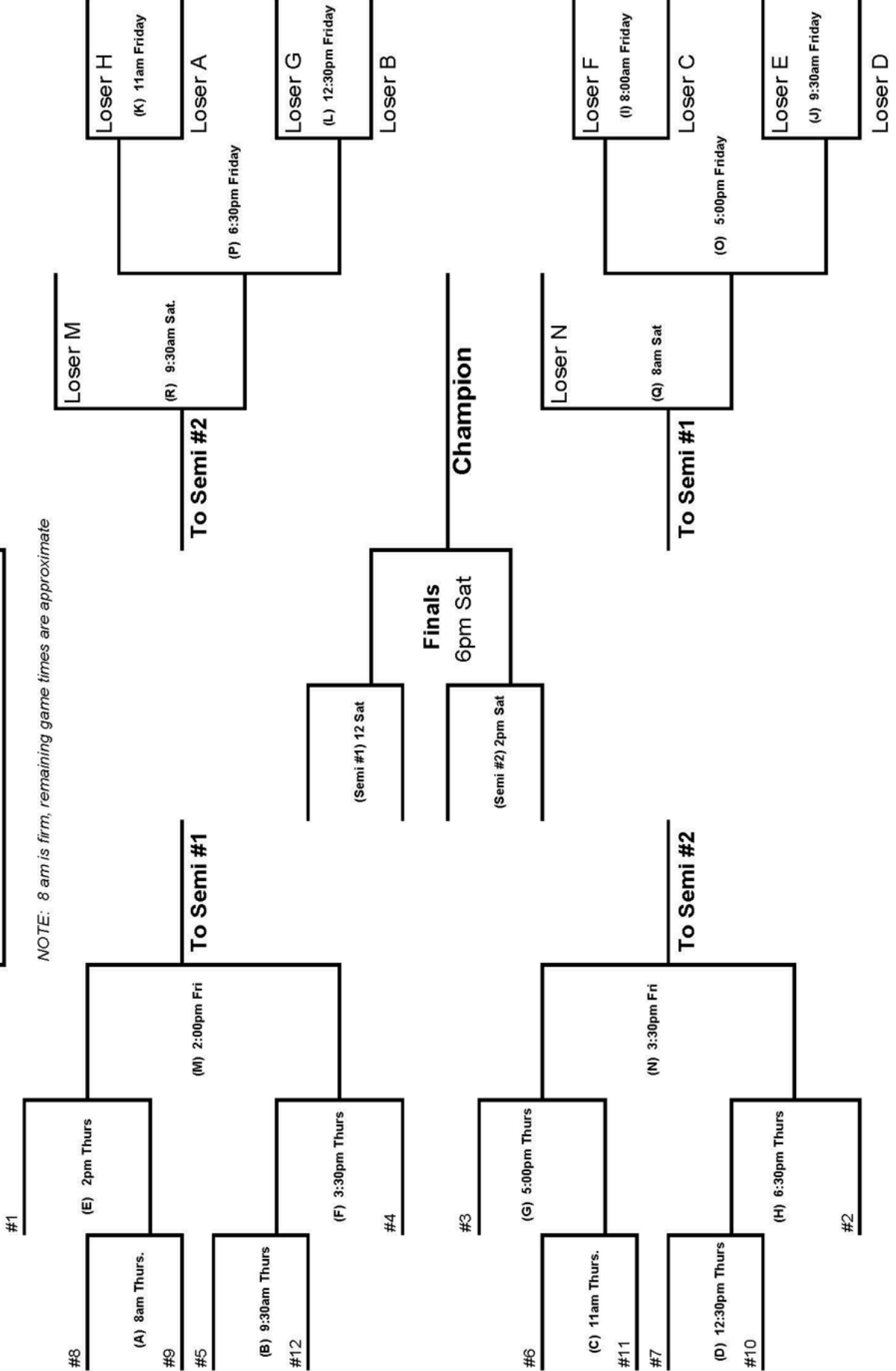

TIE-BREAK METHOD - TOURNAMENT COMPETITION

REGIONAL TIE- BREAKER METHOD (for CHSAA Playoff competition)

In the case of a tie, the Tournament Director must call the CHSAA Volleyball Administrator *BEFORE the tie breaker in order to verify (720-581-8102)*. All involved teams must sign off verifying they are in agreement that the tie was broken accurately using the following method. For regionals, there will be a 15-minute break and then the 15-minute warm-up will begin.

Match record determines the seed for advancement (i.e. match record 3-0, 2-1, 1-2).

1. Always use head-to-head whenever two teams are tied.
2. **REGIONALS:** If there is a three-way tie for only one qualifying spot, determine set percentage among TIED teams (eliminate non-tied teams). The two lowest set percentage teams will play one set to 25 points (no cap). The winner will then immediately play the highest set percentage team to determine the top seed/qualifying spot in question. If two teams are tied with the highest set percentage, use head-to-head to break the tie. **THERE MUST BE TWO, ONE-SET PLAYOFFS.**
 - a) If tie isn't broken, then same procedure will be followed taking point differential among TIED teams (eliminate non-tied teams).
 - b) If the tie isn't broken, then the same procedure will be followed taking the set percentage among ALL teams.
 - c) If tie isn't broken, then a **coin flip** will occur. All three teams will flip at the same time. You must flip until one team flips differently than the other two (i.e. 2 heads and 1 tails). The "odd" team out (tails in this case) will be set aside and the other two will play the first set to 25. The loser will be #3; the winner will then play the "odd" team out one set to 25 to determine #1 and #2.
